### **RUNNING FOR THE BOARD - DO I HAVE WHAT IT TAKES?**

Board of Trustees elections are just around the corner. If you are considering running for the Board, we ask that you take a few moments to ask yourself the following three questions:

**Do I have the time?:** As a Board member, you will need to devote at least several hours of your time each month to association business. In addition to regular monthly Board meetings, you will need to be active in email discussions and occasional special meetings.

During special projects, you may need to spend a little extra time on association business. Some Board members may also spend a little more time than others if they work with a committee.

**Can I make tough decisions when it's required?:** The primary role of the Board is to conduct the business of the Association. This doesn't just mean approving the budget, but also developing and enforcing policies. Board members are required to step outside their immediate circle of family and neighbors and make decisions based on the greater good of the community.

**Can I do all this and have fun too?:** It isn't all about policies and tough decisions. Our community is only as good as we make it, and establishing and maintaining a sense of community is a part of a Board member's responsibility. Planning and attending functions such as our events and being presence in the community are as important as any policy decisions you make.

Being a Board member can be frustrating at times, but it may also be one of the most rewarding ways you'll find to volunteer your time. # Architectural Review Board (ARB)

### Farwell to ARB Chairperson Estee Warring

The ARB members and Little Rocky Run staff would like to express their sincere thanks and appreciation to resigning ARB Chairperson, Estee Warring, for her many years of service, dedication and longtime support to the community and ARB.

Estee has been an active, vibrant and thoughtful member of the ARB for the last four years, and the chairperson for the last 20 months. Estee is leaving the ARB due to additional career obligations. We wish her the best and will miss her **very much!** 

As a result, the Architectural Review Board has an open position and welcomes any LRR homeowner, in good standing, who would consider serving on the Board. The time commitment involves (1) one meeting per month (third Mondays at 7 PM); time spent reviewing homeowner applications for improvements/architectural changes (usually an hour or so every fifth or sixth week, as the members rotate weekend "turns"). If you are interested, please send a short bio about yourself (e.g. how long you lived in the neighborhood, why you would like to join the ARB, etc.) to Cindy Young, ARB Administrator, arb@littlerockyrunhoa.org . Thank you!

### Holiday Decorations and Lights Reminder

As the holiday season quickly approaches, the ARB staff wants to remind all residents that holiday decorations and lights may be displayed on a resident's property no sooner than (45) forty-five days before a specific holiday, and all decorations and lights must be removed no later than (45) days after the holiday. Stringed or roped lighting may not be left up and/or used year-round on decks or porches.

### <u>Signs</u>

Political signs are considered a seasonal display and can only represent a declared candidate. Only (1) one sign is allowed per property lot and may only be displayed in the front yard of the property. All political signs must be removed from the property within 48 hours after the election date.

Real estate signs (offering property for sale or lease) may only be installed on the front of the property being listed, with only (1) one sign allowed per property. All "Coming Soon" signs are **Prohibited**. Real estate directional signs are not to be placed in the Common areas or at the top of the private pipestem drives.

Commercial contractor signs may be displayed at the front of a property while the work is in process (limited to (1) one sign), but signage must be removed within 48 hours of work completion.

Permanent security yard signs must be less than 12 inches in diameter. All other signage requires prior approval by the ARB.

Pick-ups begin at 6:00 AM and are completed in Little Rocky Run by 3:00 PM.

Please place your trash and recycling in appropriate, secure containers no sooner than 5 PM the night before your scheduled pick up day and promptly remove emptied trash containers from your front curb on pick up day.

If your trash is not picked up by 3:00 PM on your

scheduled day, please call American Disposal. If your trash is not removed within 24 hours after your call to American Disposal, please call the HOA Office at 703-830-0411. Feel free to leave a message if calling after hours.

Yard Waste Collection: Ends effective December 24th. If you have yard waste to be collected after this date, place your items curbside on your 2nd collection day until vard waste collection season resumes the 1st week in March.

### Trash Receptacle Bins may be purchased on



your own from American Disposal Services. Please contact American Disposal for more information on cost and specifications.

Damaged Recycle Bins may be traded in for

replacements at no cost from American Disposal. If you are new to the neighborhood and don't have a recycle bin, contact the HOA office to pick one up.



Inclement Weather: Safety in Little Rocky run is American Disposals primary concern. Roads and/ or areas which are deemed unsafe due to snow or ice will be suspended for collection.

### Townhomes

• Trash must be placed in rodent/animal-proof trash cans with a tight-fitting lid. Trash or garbage may NOT be put out in loose plastic garbage bags.

• All trash must be placed curbside in FRONT of your home, or at the egress sidewalk closest to the front of your home (only if your home faces this egress sidewalk), no earlier than 5:00 pm on the night before the scheduled pick-up day.

• TRASH MUST NOT BE PUT IN THE COMMON AREAS OR ISLANDS FOR TRASH PICKUP.

• Trash cans and recycle bins must be removed from the front of the property (must be stored at rear of property, unless in Sunset Ridge) no later than 8:00pm the same evening of the scheduled pick-up day.

American Disposal is closed on Thanksgiving Day. Since your regular trash & recycling collection falls on Thanksgiving day, trash & recycling will be collected on the scheduled make up day, Saturday, November 29th.

<u>News from the Stingrays</u>

LRR STINGRAYS By Patrick Bowman

While Stingray swimmers are settling in and building their fall training routines, the Stingray organization transitions from the 2014 season into preparation for the 2015 season. For the team's board of directors, that means filling the vacant positions on the board, reviewing the parent survey, and beginning the planning process for next summer.

The first order of business is to fill the open positions on the board, and there are several opportunities for parents to step up and take a leadership position in one of their children's favorite activities. The following positions remain open, and need to be filled so the team can operate in an efficient manner:

**Treasurer** – The Stingray's Treasurer is responsible for the management of the team's finances, including budgeting, resolution of everyday financial transactions, bookkeeping, and financial reporting. Familiarity with financial operations is a big help.

**Concessions Manager** – The concessions manager is in charge of operations of all food and beverage sales for the Stingray swim season. This includes management of the Snack Shack and SnoCone table at meets, serving as the contact for outside vendors at special events, and managing all associated equipment. Current concessions manager Damien LaRuffa has indicated that he is more than willing to be of as much or little assistance as needed. No restaurant or culinary experience required.

**Team Rep** – At the September Board meeting, 2013-2014 Team Rep John Charters volunteered to fill the position for the 2015 season, and was approved and appointed by the board. Although the position is filled for the year, ideally, the board would like to have a candidate volunteer to shadow John for the upcoming year, in hopes of a smooth transition next year.

All Board of Director positions run for two seasons. In addition, Stingray Board members' families are not required to take volunteer duties during the season and their swimmers are registered for half the regular registration fee.

The next Board meeting will be held Monday, November 3 at 7:30 PM in Rec Center 2. In addition to regular business, the board will focus on evaluating and proposing changes to the parent volunteer process. All are welcome. ### Architectural Review Board



Homeowners living in planned communities typically enjoy better property values that are associated with having architectural standards for their neighborhoods. Architectural standards are upheld in Little Rocky Run by an all-

volunteer Architectural Review Board (ARB) that is assisted by employees dedicated to this function at the HOA office. Thanks to these members of the community, the ARB is active and dedicated to maintaining the busy application/violation workload.

What do the ARB members do? ARB members make decisions on homeowner applications for exterior modifications, and recommend properties with ongoing ARB violations to the Board of Trustees for corrective action and/or legal action.

Primary Duties: The ARB is required to review, modify and approve or disapprove written applications submitted by homeowners for exterior architectural changes. Applications are reviewed for conformance with the criteria and goal set forth in the Covenants of Little Rocky Run's Architectural Standards.

ARB members are required to attend the monthly Architectural meetings (typically held the 3rd Monday of each month in the evening) for review of submitted ARB applications and maintenance violation hearings. ARB members also need to have time available to dedicate for a rotating schedule for weekend review of properties which have submitted applications for exterior modifications. These weekend reviews typically rotate on an every 4th or 6th weekend, depending on the number of ARB members currently active on the ARB. If you're planning any home construction or gardening projects this fall, please add "Call 811" to your to-do list! VA811, also commonly known as Miss Utility, is a not-for-profit organization created by Virginia's utility operators to protect their underground lines. VA811's primary goal is keeping the citizens of Virginia safe by preventing damage to underground utility lines.

In 1979, the Virginia Underground Utility Damage Prevention Act was enacted and the State Corporation Commission began enforcing the Act in 1995. In order to comply with the law, a homeowner planning to excavate or demolish should call 811 three days (excluding weekends and national holidays) prior to beginning the project. We recommend you give us a call anytime you plan to disturb the ground on your property, whether it's planting rose bushes or installing a deck!

When you call 811, here's what you can expect: a trained professional will take all the pertinent information about the work that will take place in your yard, including the address, the area in your yard where the work will take place, a description of the dig site, the type of work you'll be doing, and any other necessary information. Once the call is complete, you'll receive a reference or ticket number and information on how to access the responses from the utility companies. The utility companies will most likely send out professional utility line locators to determine where the underground utilities are located on your property.

Please remember to dig with C. A. R. E.! Call before you dig. Allow the required time for marking. Respect the marks. Excavate carefully.
