Please place your trash and recycling in appropriate, secure containers **no sooner than 6pm the night before** your scheduled pick up day and promptly remove emptied containers from your front curb or open space on pick up day. <u>If your trash is not picked up by</u> <u>3:00pm on your scheduled day</u>, please call American Disposal. If your trash is not removed within 24 hours after your call to ADS, please call the HOA Office at 703-830-0411. Feel free to leave a message if calling after hours. Trash & Recycling Schedule <u>Single Family Homes</u> Recycling - Thursday Trash - Monday/Thursday <u>Town Homes</u> Recycling - Tuesday Trash - Tuesday/Friday Yard debris pick up will begin March 7th through December 31st in the single family homes. Pickup days will be Wednesday for Single Family Homes and Friday for Townhomes.

As a reminder, yard debris or "yard waste" is defined as grass clippings, leaves, small twigs/branches and brush that results from general yard and landscape maintenance. Brush is defined as the woody part of tree trimings or prunings with a branch and/or trunk diameter of six inches or less,. Brush shall be cut in lengths of 4 foot or less by residents, and bundled and tied or placed in clearly marked rigid containers.

# Enforcement of trash and recycling

Little Rocky Run and all of its neighborhoods have covenants that regulate certain aspects of property maintenance. These covenants were designed to uphold the standards and requirements within the guidelines of the community. Your attention and cooperation in this matter would be greatly appreciated. When living in such close proximity, consideration for others by adhering to state and local ordinances is imperative. We do realize that everyone's work and life schedules in this day and age are very busy however; attention to the trash issue must be made a priority by all members of your household. The following are the guidelines set forth and will be enforced by the HOA.

• Trash must be stored at the rear of your property in **watertight, rodent-proof containers** that are equipped with tight-fitting lids. Trash should never be stored on your property loose or in plastic bags of any kind. This is a Fairfax County Ordinance monitored by the Health Department. We have sought the help of the Health Department in many instances and will continue to do so to ensure compliance.

• Trash and recyclables are to be placed at the curb in front of your property, no earlier than 6:00 p.m. the night before the scheduled pickup. Trash is not to be put out in bags unless they are heavy duty. **Small shopping/grocery bags are not allowed.** 

• Trash containers are to be removed from the curb no later than the evening of trash pickups. Any cans left at the curb later than the evening of trash pickup may be picked up by LRR maintenance staff.

• Trash containers and recycling bins are to be stored out of public view at all times. <u>Please do not store these items on front porches, in the front or side of your home, or on your back decks.</u>

People and Pets

The HOA fields calls every day regarding pets in the neighborhood. The majority of complaints involve excess barking, loose or unleashed dogs, pet waste and pets on private property.

Little Rocky Run's policy is for all residents to adhere to all Fairfax County guidelines and ordinances in regards to animal control. All dogs must be kept under leash control at all times and are not permitted to foul others' property. Owners shall not allow pets to run loose or walk dogs on other residents' private property. Dogs can be walked on Little Rocky Run open space, however they must be on leash and in your control at all times and the waste cleaned up and properly disposed of. Open space areas are routinely used as play areas so waste cleanup and proper disposal are imperative. In addition, pet waste is not to accumulate on your own property. All pet waste should be cleaned up and disposed of on a routine basis. Little Rocky Run HOA is adding more pet waste stations after the recent successful test. Please let the HOA office know (hoa@littlerockyrunhoa.org) if you want to suggest a location for a station. Please be advised that any animal control issues as well as reporting pet clean-up violators can be reported to the Fairfax County Animal Control at 703-830-1100.

### Special Pickups (Large Items)

American Disposal will arrange a special collection of some large items at no extra charge. Some items will incur an additional charge such as refrigerators, dish washers, washing machines, etc. Call American Disposal at 703-368-0500 or visit them online at

<u>www.americandisposal.com</u> for more information.

Special pickups are usually made on the second regular collection day of the week if you call <u>at least 72 hours in advance</u>. Please remember it is illegal to dump refuse of any sort on property belonging to others around our neighborhood.

*NOTE:* Recreation Center trash cans are not intended for bulk trash drop off or homeowner trash. Your cooperation is appreciated.

# HOW DO I SAFELY DISPOSE OF FIREPLACE ASHES?

Improper ash removal from fireplaces and wood burning stoves cause thousands of fires every year. According to the National Fire Protection Agency, 9870 house fires were caused yearly (1994-1998 statistics) due to improperly discarded ashes.

Hot coals, hidden in a pile of ashes and thus well insulated, can stay hot for up to 4 days.

Never empty ashes into a paper or plastic bag, cardboard box, or other similar container. The only suitable means

for ash storage is a metal container with a tight fitting lid; this helps keep air from blowing through and disturbing ashes which can leave hot coals exposed for re-ignition. Many home fires begin from improperly stored ashes while the home's occupants are asleep, as the evening breeze intensifies.

For optimum safety, wet the wood ashes prior to attaching the metal lid to the pail. DO NOT store your metal ash container on your deck, in your garage, or in any location that may allow heat to transfer from those hot coals to nearby flammable items. Untold wooden decks catch fire every year due to this simple oversight.



# CAN YOUR ASHES

Northern Virginia's Fairfax County has begun a homeowner safety awareness program called "Can Your Ashes" in an effort to reduce the hundreds of thousands of dollars in home damages caused each year by fireplace and wood stove ashes that have been improperly handled. Help spread the word in your community too!

# FINAL DISPOSAL

Wood ash, once completely cooled, can safely be disposed of in your garden because natural firewood ash makes a great soil additive that your plants will enjoy. Just make sure you have removed any mulching materials such as dried leaves and other dried plants first, so there's nothing to catch fire in your garden. Spray the dispersed ashes with water as an added safety precaution. Do not add ashes to your soil if you burn coal, or ashes from burned wood that was painted, stained or treated with any chemicals as these chemicals may be harmful to your soil and plants.

# ARB CORNER

Architectural Review Board

Thinking of new home improvement projects? Building a deck, porch, or shed? Changing exterior paint color? Adding onto your home? Please remember to submit an Exterior Alteration Application as soon as possible before beginning your project. Per our neighborhood covenants, many improvements require prior approval by the Little Rocky Run Architectural Review Board. Good news - many more home improvements are pre-approved and do not require an application. Please review the Architectural and Maintenance Standards on the LRR website (http://www.littlerockyrunhoa.org) to see if your planned project requires

an application.

Have you already completed an improvement project without submitting an application? Please go ahead and submit an application for approval retroactively. Doing so will ensure you're not caught trying to sell your home with an unapproved alteration - something that can slow the transaction. Keep in mind, however, that even completed alterations must be consistent with the Architectural and Maintenance Standards.

The ARB members are your neighbors and fully support your efforts to improve and maintain your property. To this end, the ARB promises to act on all applications in a timely and fair manner.

# ARB VIOLATION PROCEDURE

No one wants to consider getting a notice of violation from the HOA, but should the unfortunate occur, the ARB would like you to be aware of what you can do to mitigate the situation. First read the notice and determine what the violation is, i.e. trash out too early, overgrown grass. If you're having trouble understanding what the violation is for, you can contact the HOA office for clarification. Next, rectify the violation if possible. You can use the Architectural Guidelines provided on the HOA website as a resource. Lastly, you're encouraged to attend the next ARB meeting so that you may speak with the Board of Trustees and explain the extenuating circumstance leading to the violation or show that it's been corrected. Should you be unable to attend, an email is an acceptable alternative. If you decline to take any action after receiving a notice of violation, you risk having it forwarded to the Board, which can issue a fine for the violation.

# WINTER DRIVING TIPS

If you're planning to venture out on the roads in wintry conditions, it is important to be safe and be prepared. Winter driving poses several risks and to stay as safe as possible, motorists should refresh themselves on winter driving do's and don'ts:

# Winter Driving Do's

Prepare your vehicle for cold weather. Check battery, ignition system, lights, brakes, tires, the exhaust system and windshield wipers.

Slow down. When the roads are icy allow extra time to reach your destination. Rushing creates risks.

Pack an emergency kit. Ice scraper, shovels, kitty litter, towels, blankets, coats, mittens, a cell phone, water and extra food in case road conditions strand you in your vehicle.

Use major routes. After it snows major roads are cleared and treated first. Avoid secondary roads.

Dress as if you were going to be stranded. It can get very cold in a car on the side of the road waiting for help. Be sure to have extra blankets and to insist that children who may be traveling with you do the same.

Use low gear to get out of a tough spot. You need steady pulling and moderate power when traction is poor. The best remedy when wheels are stuck is to put the car in low gear and apply power slowly. Keep the wheels pointed straight ahead so the vehicle can move in a straight line. If you can't go forward, try backing out, steering in the vehicle's tracks.

# Winter Driving Don'ts

Avoid slamming on brakes. Minimize brake use on very slippery, icy roads and hills; if further speed reduction is needed use a gentle and slow brake application.

Avoid changing lanes. On a four-lane highway, stay in the lane that has been cleared most recently. Changing lanes over built-up snow between lanes may cause you to lose control of the vehicle.

Never use cruise control. When driving on any slippery wet, icy surface cruise control prevents you from having total control over your vehicle.

Prevent from braking with an ABS. An anti-lock brake system allows the wheels to lock momentarily. Do not pump the pedal or remove your foot from the brake when you feel the brake pedal vibrate and pulse against your foot.

Do not drive in four-wheel-drive. It will get you going faster and easier but it does not provide an advantage in stopping.

Do not panic. If your vehicle skids out of control steer in the direction you want the front of the vehicle to go. To regain control of your vehicle, stay calm.

# LRR STINGRAYS

It's a great time to begin planning for a summer of fun at the pool. Does your family enjoy swimming, community involvement, exercise, and team spirit? If so, consider joining or returning to the Stingrays!

The Stingrays includes 250-280 swimmers ranging in age from 4-18 years. Our team has swimmers of all ability levels, from beginners who can barely make it across the pool to top local high school swimmers. All participants enjoy safe and fun swim

practices organized by age, in addition to social events like pep rallies, donut days, and Family Fun Night. It's a wonderful summertime activity that helps improve swim skills, build self esteem, foster community involvement, and create new friendships.

All residents of Little Rocky Run in good standing are eligible to become members of the Stingrays. Swimmers 8 years of age and younger must be able to swim one length of the pool using any stroke, while swimmers 9 years and older must swim two lengths using any stroke, by the first time trial, which typically takes place three weeks after the start of the season. The Stingrays participate in two meets per week during the season, one on Saturday for the fastest swimmers and one on Monday that's open to everyone; all swimmers have the chance to compete if they wish.

In preparation for the summer season, consider the Stingrays winter swim program. This program is open to any of our 2011 Stingrays swimmers and gives them the chance to stay in shape and further work on their swimming techniques. Coach Beth Bedell runs the program, assisted by several of our Stingrays junior coaches. They swim from 5-6 pm on Sundays at Cub Run Rec Center. There is one more session in the spring. Sign up and cost information is available at <u>www.</u> swimwithbeth.com.

We are currently accepting applications for volunteer lane assistants and junior coaches. To be a volunteer lane coach you must be at least 14 years old and a member of the 2012 Stingrays swim team. To be a junior coach, you must be at least 15 years old and a member of the 2012 Stingrays swim team. Junior coaches, only those who are 15 years old, must also be lifeguard certified as required by federal regulations.
