Please place your trash and recycling in appropriate, secure containers **no sooner than 6pm the night before** your scheduled pick up day and promptly remove emptied containers from your front curb or open space on pick up day. <u>If your trash is not picked up by</u> <u>3:00pm on your scheduled day</u>, please call American Disposal. If your trash is not removed within 24 hours after your call to ADS, please call the HOA Office at 703-830-0411. Feel free to leave a message if calling after hours.

Trash & Recycling Schedule

<u>Single Family Homes</u> Recycling - Thursday Trash - Monday/Thursday <u>Town Homes</u> Recycling - Tuesday Trash - Tuesday/Friday

Yard Debris pick up will run through

December 31st. Pickup days will be Wednesday for Single Family Homes and Friday for Townhomes. As a reminder, yard debris or "yard waste" is defined as grass clippings, leaves, small twigs/branches and brush that results from general yard and landscape maintenance. Brush is defined as the woody part of tree trimmings or pruning with a branch and/ or trunk diameter of six inches or less. Brush shall be cut in lengths of 4 foot or less by residents, and bundled and tied or placed in clearly marked rigid containers.

Enforcement of trash and recycling

Little Rocky Run and all of its neighborhoods have covenants that regulate certain aspects of property maintenance. These covenants were designed to uphold the standards and requirements within the guidelines of the community. Your attention and cooperation in this matter would be greatly appreciated. When living in such close proximity, consideration for others by adhering to state and local ordinances is imperative. We do realize that everyone's work and life schedules in this day and age are very busy however; attention to the trash issue must be made a priority by all members of your household. The following are the guidelines set forth and will be enforced by the HOA.

• Trash must be stored at the rear of your property in **watertight**, **rodent-proof containers** that are equipped with tight-fitting lids. Trash should never be stored on your property loose or in plastic bags of any kind. This is a Fairfax County Ordinance monitored by the Health Department. We have sought the help of the Health Department in many instances and will continue to do so to ensure compliance.

Trash and recyclables are to be placed at the curb in front of your property, <u>no earlier than 6:00 p.m. the night before the scheduled pickup</u>. Trash is not to be put out in bags unless they are heavy duty. Small shopping/grocery bags are not allowed.
Trash containers are to be removed from the curb no later than the evening of trash pickups. Any cans left at the curb later than the evening of trash pickup may be picked up by LRR maintenance staff.

• Trash containers and recycling bins are to be stored out of public view at all times. <u>Please do not store these items on front porches, in the front of your home, or on your back decks.</u>

CARDBOARD ITEMS

<u>PLEASE DISPOSE OF</u> <u>ALL CARDBOARD ITEMS</u> <u>ON YOUR SCHEDULED</u> <u>RECYCLING DAYS.</u>

Per Fairfax County Code Section 109.1-2-2. Recycling for Residential Solid Waste.

 (a) Occupants of single-family homes and townhouses shall source-separate: container glass; metal food and beverage containers; plastic bottles and jugs; yard waste; scrap metal; <u>cardboard</u> and mixed paper, including but not limited to corrugated cardboard, magazines, newspaper, office paper, and miscellaneous paper products.

Single-stream collectors using packer trucks must collect <u>all</u> recyclables that are properly set out. <u>In particular, all cardboard must</u> <u>be collected for recycling</u>.

Special Pickups (Large Items)

American Disposal will arrange a special collection of some large items at no extra charge. Some items will incur an additional charge such as refrigerators, dish washers, washing machines, etc. Call American Disposal at 703-368-0500 or visit them online at

<u>www.americandisposal.com</u> for more information.

Special pickups are usually made on the second regular collection day of the week if you call <u>at least 72 hours in advance</u>. Please remember it is illegal to dump refuse of any sort on property belonging to others around our neighborhood.

NOTE: Recreation Center trash cans are not intended for bulk trash drop off or homeowner trash. Your cooperation is appreciated.

MOST COMMON TOPICS IN NEED OF CLARIFICATION FOR LRR HOA RESIDENTS: (AS SUMMARIZED FROM VARIOUS LRR HOA DOCUMENTS)

Together, we can help residents be good neighbors!

ARB: EXTERIOR ALTERATIONS TO PROPERTY

- Residents shall not make any additions or remove anything from common property belonging to Little Rocky Run HOA.
- Grass shall be maintained at a height not to exceed six (6) inches. All edging (ie. Around sidewalks, driveways, curbs, fences, etc.) shall be kept in good repair. Grass, flower and shrubbery beds shall be kept free of weeds and debris.
- Residents shall submit an Exterior Alteration application and obtain ARB approval prior to altering the exterior or property. For more information, please visit our website: <u>www.littlerockyrunhoa.org</u>, "About our Neighborhood"/ "Architectural Guidelines."

PARKING & TOWING

- Townhomes with "Approved Parking Plans" (Clarendon Springs Pl., Clarendon Springs Ct., Chestnut Hollow Ct., Forest Pond Ct., Giant Oak Ct., Meadow Crest Ct., Wakley Ct., Waterdale Ct., Waterflow Pl., Water Springs Ct., Wildflower Ln., Rabbit Hill Ct.) have assigned parking for residents. Violators will be towed.
- Recreational, Commercial and inoperable vehicles are not to be parked in HOA parking lots or in private driveways. Violators will receive a letter or will be towed.

<u>PETS</u>

- Per Fairfax County Law, dogs must be kept under leash control at all times. Owners shall not allow pets to run loose or walk dogs on private property.
- Per Fairfax County Law, dog owners must clean up pet waste and dispose of properly.

STORAGE

- Toys, garden equipment/supplies, construction materials/tools, newspapers and miscellaneous debris shall be stored out of public view.
- No items shall be placed outside property lines/behind back fences on HOA common area.

<u>SIGNS</u>

• Real Estate signs, political signs and commercial contractor signs may be placed on a lot but subject to limitations and restrictions. One sign per home. Political signs and contractor signs must be removed 48 hours after the election or work completion. Real Estate signs must be removed 5 days after a ratified non-contingent contract.

2012 SCOUT FOR FOOD Bag Day - November 3 Pick-up Day - November 10

On November 3th, Cub Scouts from Pack 717, 1858, 1859, and 1860, Boy Scouts from Troop 717 and 577, local Girl Scouts plus scout families and friends will leave bags on your doors or mailboxes.

All donations will go to Western Fairfax Christian Ministries (WFCM) Food Pantry in Chantilly to help local families in need, regardless of religion. Items needed include: canned meat, vegetables, fruit, pasta, beans, soup, juice, evaporated milk, tomato sauce/paste, spaghetti sauce; boxed rice, pasta, oatmeal, grits, pancake mix, plus syrup; 2 lb package of sugar, flour, rice; 1 lb package dried beans, peas, lentils; 24 or 36 oz Cooking Oil; boxed potatoes, stuffing; hygiene products like bar soap, deodorant, shampoo, toothpaste, laundry or dish detergent. PLEASE, NO GLASS OR FROZEN OR PERISHABLE FOOD.
