Community Wide Inspections in Process

In order to keep our community looking great, Little Rocky Run HOA conducts annual community-wide property inspections. Community-wide inspections of resident properties will start on Monday, April 22, 2013, and continue throughout the summer and fall 2013. ARB staff will be out in the community inspecting, and will be entering the exterior of homeowner's properties. Staff members will have their ID badges.

Homeowners will be sent a letter from the HOA citing the maintenance issues found on their property which need to be corrected. Homeowners will be given (60) days to correct the maintenance violations cited, unless the violations are related to overgrown lawn/yard maintenance, trash and debris, or improper trash container storage. These issues must be addressed and corrected within (7) days of the notice.

Did you know...

Waste and recycling collection is in the Top 9 Most Dangerous Jobs in the United States!? Every day our employees are not only exposed to the hazards of working on roads in congested Metropolitan cities, but also to the small percentage of our customers' medical waste that is improperly placed into trash bags. As you may already be aware, needles and syringes placed into standard plastic trash bags, increases our employees' risk of being exposed to dangerous blood-borne diseases, (like HIV or Hepatitis B/C) if they were to be stuck with the disposed material.

We are frequently asked by our customers, 'what is the proper procedure for disposal of needles, syringes, leftover medications and pill bottles?' The following information will ensure the safety of our employees, protect them from getting injured on the job, while also keeping in mind the toll that medical waste takes on our environment.

Drop-Off Collection Points

Various local pharmacies, doctors' offices, hospitals, health clinics or many community organizations provide convenient drop-off points for proper disposal of household medical waste. These can be used for the collection of needles or syringes, as well as leftover or outdated medications. Ask your health care provider for their suggestion for the best method of disposal for your particular prescription.

Household Hazardous Waste Centers

Many facilities, such as your local landfill, already have a special designated area for the collection of household hazardous waste, which includes paint, oil or batteries. Check with these hazardous waste centers in your area to see if medical waste is included in their program.

Mail-back Programs

There are several companies that provide containers for at-home collection that can then be mailed back for proper disposal. These can be used for the collection of needles/ syringes, but many will also accept leftover pill medications that can be very hazardous when simply thrown in with your trash. These toxic chemicals can leak into our waterways causing harm to marine-life. For more information on needle disposal, visit: http://www.safeneedledisposal.org

Curbside Disposal

As a last resort, American Disposal Services will accept medical waste that has been placed into a thick, hard, impenetrable plastic bottle with a secure lid (example: detergent bottle). This bottle MUST be placed in with your trash, not with recycling. Remember, Needles/syringes or any sharp items should never be left exposed in a plastic or paper bag as they could severely injure or infect our employees.

Recycling Pill Bottles

Plastic bottles (and caps) that contain pills or various medications ARE recyclable! Simply rinse out any residue, tear off of the label containing personal information, and toss in with your recyclables.

Pick-ups begin at 6:00am and are completed in Little Rocky Run by 3:00pm.

Please place your trash and recycling in appropriate, secure containers **no sooner than 5pm the night before** your scheduled pick up day and promptly remove emptied containers from your front curb or open space on pick up day.

If your trash is not picked up by 3:00pm on your scheduled day, please call American Disposal. If your trash is not removed within 24 hours after your call to ADS, please call the HOA Office at 703-830-0411. Feel free to leave a mesage if calling after hours.

New Trash Policy

Approved by the Board of Trustees on April 11, 2013

#28—All garbage, to include: yard debris, trash and recycled material shall not be allowed to accumulate on the exterior of any property. The disposal of debris or trash on the common areas is strictly prohibited.

#29(a) -- Yard Debris: Grass clippings and leaves are to be placed out in clear plastic bags or brown paper bags (black plastic bags will not be picked up on yard debris days). Tree limbs and brush must be no longer than (4) four feet in length and no thicker than (6) six inches thick in diameter. These items must be tied with rope or twine in arm length bundles. Bagged or bundled items are not to exceed 50 lbs. Brush is defined as the woody part of tree trimmings or pruning with a branch and/or trunk diameter of six inches or less. Unbound piles of branches will not be picked up. PLEASE NOTE THAT DIRT, ROCK, SOD, SOIL, CONCRETE, BRICKS, TIRES OR TREE STUMPS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP.

#29(b) -- All recycled material must be placed in a designated recycle bin.

#29(c) - Trash must be placed in rodent/animal-proof trash cans with a lid. Trash cans shall not be overstuffed, in order to allow proper closure of the container.

For Detached Properties - Trash must be placed in rodent/animal-proof trash cans with a lid. Trash or garbage may not be put out in plastic garbage bags. Trash cans shall not be overstuffed, in order to allow proper closure of the can. All trash must be placed curbside, no earlier than 5:00 pm on the night before the scheduled pick-up day. Trash cans and recycle bins must be removed from the curbside, no later than 8:00 pm the same evening of the scheduled pick-up day.

For Attached Properties - Trash must be placed in rodent/animal-proof trash cans with a lid. Trash or garbage may not be put out in plastic garbage bags. Trash cans shall not be overstuffed, in order to allow proper closure of the can. ALL TRASH MUST BE PLACED CURBSIDE IN FRONT OF YOUR HOME, OR AT THE EGRESS SIDEWALK CLOSEST TO THE FRONT OF YOUR HOME. Trash must be placed in the appropriate location in front of your residence, no earlier than 5:00 pm on the night before the scheduled pickup day. Trash cans and recycle bins must be removed no later than 8:00 pm the same evening of the scheduled pick-up day. TRASH MUST NOT BE PUT IN THE COMMON AREAS OR ISLANDS FOR TRASH PICKUP.

Storm drain markers on drains across Fairfax County tell us that anything washed or dumped down a storm drain goes directly into our streams, not to a water treatment plant. Our nearest stream, Occoquan Reservoir, leads to the Potomac River, a source of drinking water and recreation.

Don't let pollutants from these sources go down the drain. Prevention is easy!

- Sediment: Bare soil, sand.
 - Grow native plants and use mulch on bare soil.
- Nutrients: Fertilizer, yard debris.
 - Limit fertilizer use, compost or bag yard debris, practice bay-friendly yard care.
- **Toxics:** Pesticides, motor oil, lead-based paint, salt.
 - Keep suds from car washing out of the storm drain they can be toxic to wildlife.
