Notes from the Trustees

WOW, the summer we all waited so long for is now more than half over. Our residents are taking those last vacation days and the schools will be opening in a few weeks. Where does the time go?

The staff and Board of Trustees (BoT) remained busy over the summer. A few of the many activities we are working on are below. Read on and let us know your thoughts.

Energy Audit In an effort to continuously watch our finances, CJ from our maintenance staff has expanded our energy audit. We've already retrofitted our pools with LED lighting (brighter and cheaper to operate) and we can already see the efforts paying off in lower utility bills. The next step is to begin a review of one of our Recreation Centers to see if efficiencies can be found there.

Townhouse Parking This has always been a touchy subject, and the BoT will be discussing this in further detail at the September BoT meeting. Currently, any townhouse section can initiate a parking plan within their area for approval by the BoT. Over time, these have diverged to a point where we have different parking regulations throughout the townhouse community. The BoT is reviewing the existing parking plans and considering a policy revision to bring ALL townhouse neighborhoods under a single/common policy. Join us at the September meeting at Rec Center #1 to share your opinions.

Tennis Courts As noted last month, we are starting to look at updating and refurbishing our tennis courts. Most are approximately 30 years old and showing their age. Being a big ticket item, we are looking cautiously at what must be done verses what should be done. Our goal is to bring these facilities back into first class shape.

Currently, only the courts near Rec Center #1 on Little Rocky Run Circle have lights. We are considering the addition of lights on the other 2 sets of courts on Springstone and Stonefield Drives. We would like to hear your opinions on lights and the need for refurbishment of the courts. Please contact the HOA office with your thoughts and we will keep you informed via this column as we move forward. We are open to discussions being held in October.

New Recycling Containers

As noted last month and again elsewhere in this issue of the News On The Run, we are providing new larger and wheeled recycling containers. They will be delivered to all single family residences beginning in August and, since we realize the townhouse areas may have storage constraints, these containers may be an issue; they will therefore be delivered to townhomes on an 'as requested' basis. A couple of the reasons we are expanding our recycling program with these containers is that collectively we are now recycling nearly half of our community waste and we want to reduce the amount of 'flying recyclables' that come out of the smaller bins with no lids, that arte currently in use.

After some very limited polling we found that a large majority of the single family residences wanted these containers, thus the decision to deliver to all single family homes. If you do not want a container, you have two options:

- If you happen to be home when the container is being delivered, just ask not to have one left at your home
- If one is delivered and you do not want it, please call the HOA office and we will arrange to have it retrieved.

It should also be noted that the recycling container remains the property of the Little Rocky Run HOA and our trash contractor, so the container stays with the home if you happen to move.

Pools Past Labor Day

On a trial basis, this year, we are going to keep Pool #1 open on the weekends, throughout September. See the article elsewhere in this issue of the Run for pool days and hours in September and information related to the always popular 'doggie swim' at Pools #1 and #3.

A new scam

We have had reports in the single family area about a new scam where the resident receives a phone call with a notice that curb house number painting will be taking place and that unless you call to say 'no', they will assume you are granting permission to move forward with the painting and then bill you later. This is NOT an HOA sponsored activity. The BoT is powerless to stop this type of business activity but we figured it best to warn you.

As a final note and reminder, **there is no August BoT meeting** and the September meeting will be held at Rec Center #1 on Little Rocky Run Circle so we are nearer to those most affected by the townhouse parking discussion.

That's all for now. Enjoy the last few weeks of summer.

<u>Pet Waste – Be a Responsible Pet Owner</u>

Little Rocky Run has been asked to print Fairfax County guidelines and ordinances pertaining to pets, in particular the "Leash Law", "Pooper Scooper" and "Noise" regulations. Animal Control has been authorized to pick up dogs, cats and other animals that pose a public nuisance or threaten public safety or health.

It is against the law to allow animals to run loose on public property or the private property of others. Dogs must be restrained by a dependable leash and controlled by a responsible person when off the property of the owner. Dog owners must pick-up waste deposited by their pets on others' property or in any common areas. Pet waste is not to be picked up/cleaned from your own property and then disposed of in the common area open space.

"The owner or custodian of any dog shall be responsible for the removal of excreta deposited by such dog on the property of another, including public areas (*County Code Sections* 41-1-2, 108-5-2 and 41-2-6). The county law requiring pet owners to pick up waste on public or another's private property is too often being disregarded. Pet owners are asked to please do their part to keep the environment healthy and clean. Violations of these animal regulations may result in a fine ranging from \$250 to up to \$2,500.

Animals that howl, bark, meow, or squawk frequently and habitually are declared a noise disturbance any time when plainly audible across property lines or through partitions.

To report an infraction call (703) 691-2131 and ask for an Animal Control Officer.



Important Note about Yard Waste Collection

With the warm weather months upon us, more people are out gardening and doing yard maintenance and lawn improvements. Please keep the following guidelines in mind when putting your lawn and yard waste debris out for pickup:

Routine yard waste pickup for the single-family residences is scheduled for every Wednesday by the trash service company, from March through December. Yard debris waste pickup for the townhome residences is scheduled for every Friday during these same months. **Grass clippings and leaves must be placed in compostable paper yard waste bags, or personal containers clearly marked 'Yard Debris Material' for pickup. Effective March 1, 2017, American Disposal will no longer accept lawn debris in any kind of plastic bag, clear or otherwise.**

Please refrain from putting out your yard debris for pickup before <u>5:00</u> pm on the night before the scheduled pick-up day. This rule also applies to putting out your trash containers and recycling bins for trash pickup. Putting out lawn debris and trash containers out earlier than the evening before pickup is unsightly and detracts from the beauty of our community.

Architectural and Maintenance Standards July 12, 2007, Revised Trash Policy #29(a); Yard Debris: Grass clippings and leaves are to be placed out in clear plastic bags (to be removed) or brown paper bags (black plastic bags will not be picked up on yard debris days). Tree limbs and brush must be no longer than (4) four feet in length and no thicker than (6) six inches thick in diameter. These items must be tied with rope or twine in arm length bundles. Bagged or bundled items are not to exceed 50 lbs. Brush is defined as the woody part of tree trimmings or pruning with a branch and/or trunk diameter of six inches or less. Unbound piles of branches will not be picked up.







When the Unthinkable Weather Event Strikes – Are You Prepared to Respond?

Severe storms – like 2012's derecho, only worse – strike Fairfax County, causing widespread flooding, power outages, and road closures. Many buildings are damaged; people are injured; and 911 is overwhelmed and unreachable. If Little Rocky Run was affedted, would you know what to do?

The Community Emergency Respond Team (CERT) program prepares citizens to safely help themselves, their families and their communities in the event of major disasters where first responders are delayed.

CERT grew out of a Los Angeles Fire Department earthquake preparedness initiative in 1985, and is now a nationwide program run by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) that takes an "all-hazards" approach to community preparedness and response.

Taught by experienced instructors from the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department and CERT volunteer instructors, the class combines 20+ hours of classroom learning with hands-on training in light search and rescue techniques, disaster medicine, fire suppression, lifting and cribbing and other necessary skills. Classes are regulalrey scheduled at the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Academy on West Ox Road and, if there is sufficient interest, classes can be conducted at local venues (including in our neighborhood).

CERT training is FREE and all people, 18 and older, who live, work, worship or spend significant time in Fairfax County are eligible for CERT training. CERT students are given a basic kit of disaster response and personal protective equipment, including a helmet, reflective vest, backpack, headlamp, and more. Team Areas	Team Areas are NOT allowed in the Little Rocky Run Pool facility. Anyone near or on LRR pool property before 7 AM will be considered to be trespassing and local authorities will be notified.
	Team areas may be set up at the Union Mill Elementary School ball fields (behind the school) NO EARLIER THAN 7 AM on Saturday morning. Tents that are set up prior to 7AM on meet day will be removed. The island in the center of the Union Mill Elementary School parking lot, and the parking lot perimeter, are required to remain clear for safety in the parking lot. NO TEAM may use the those areas.
	Tents and awnings are strongly encouraged. Grills, generators, and fires are NOT allowed in the team areas.
	LRR will provide changing tents for swimmer who need to change on-site. No access to bath house changing rooms or bathrooms will be permitted for participants or spectators. Portable restrooms will be located in both the team areas and the pool parking lot (for spectators).
	As always, Coaches are responsible for ensuring that their swimmers report to the Clerk-of-Course on time.
Viewing Areas	The Host Pool will open to the public at 7:30 AM.
	Reserving bleacher seats will only be permitted on half of the bleachers and will be clearly marked. Reserving bleacher seats with anything larger than a beach towel (approx. 6 ft. in length) is strictly prohibited. One person may reserve no more than two seats with one beach towel and must occupy that towel. Marshals will remove materials covering bleachers to "reserve" seats except as described above. Please encourage your swimmers to leave the bleachers open for adults and non- swimming children. Umbrellas will not be permitted in the bleachers.
	Deck area surrounding the bleachers will be limited. To facilitate the movement of pedestrian traffic on the deck, certain areas will be designated "NO STANDING" and a Marshal will be positioned to maintain pedestrian flow.
	The Little Rocky Run clubhouse and facilities will NOT be open to the public. An area for handicapped seating and a handicapped-accessible restroom will be available.
