Keeping our community attractive adds to the overall appearance of our Community and that is just one more reason why LRR is a great place to live.

Beyond maintaining our Association's open space landscaping and physical appearance of our community facilities, the Association is also responsible for assuring that in the exterior physical appearance of privately owned properties within the Little Rocky Run community are appropriately maintained in accord with the architectural and maintenance standards of our association.

The Board of Trustees relies upon our dedicated volunteer residents who serve on the Architectural Review Board (ARB) and a full time staff member to review properties for compliance with exterior property maintenance standards. The ARB also reviews all ARB applications for exterior modifications to an owner's property. The inspection program and the review of applications for exterior modifications are essential activities that not only are incumbent upon the Association legally, but more importantly essential to maintaining the are appearance of properties the to enjoyment of our community and the value of our homes.

In accomplishing this responsibility, the people involved in its implementation seek to do so in a constructive and cooperative way. Our experience is that the vast majority of homeowners, upon notice, do make the exterior improvements that are necessary. Unfortunately, we do have some owners, perhaps complicated by their being absentee, who may be less interested in compliance with property maintenance standards. With these properties, an extraordinary amount of time and effort is expended to seek compliance.

We share the information on the association's program and the types of property maintenance issues that we are experiencing in an effort to increase awareness and to encourage all of us to be proactive in addressing any of the issues that may exist. Being vigilant in caring for our individually owned properties is the most effective and efficient way for us to contribute to maintaining the quality of Little Rocky Run as a great place to live.

Later in this issue there is an article that explains how and when an inspection occurs and identifies the "top ten" types of property maintenance issues that were identified during the past year.

Thank you for your efforts in contributing to the appearance and the quality of our Community.



## Keeping Our Community Attractive

The LRR HOA is tasked with monitoring the appearance and exterior conditions of the 2,722 properties within Little Rocky Run, and ensuring that residents comply with the Architectural and Maintenance Standards that have been developed for the community.

Homeowners are encouraged to be proactive, and check their homes, and make any necessary repairs on an on-going basis so that the community-wide inspection on their streets result in no, or very limited property maintenance issues.

On occasion, we are asked what and when a property will be inspected? The answer is that several different scenarios can prompt a property inspection.

 POAA Disclosure Inspections: When a property is offered for sale, the seller is required by law to purchase a disclosure document from the Homeowners Association (HOA) for potential buyers to review before going to settlement. This document includes a report on the physical condition of the exterior of the home and notes any potential discrepancies with the Architectural and Maintenance Standards that are found during the inspection. The inspection report becomes a permanent part of the property file.

- 2) <u>Community-Wide Inspections</u>: Each year, a quarter section of the Little Rocky Run community is inspected in a community-wide inspection, to address the overall exterior maintenance of the home and the property of the home in that specific area. The Little Rocky Run streets to be inspected for a given year are published in the newsletter in late winter/early spring each year.
- 3) <u>Submission of an ARB application</u>: When a homeowner submits an ARB application for making exterior changes to a property, they grant permission for members of the ARB and Conservancy staff to inspect the property as part of the application review process. Photos of the property are often taken by the staff and included with the ARB's application review information.
- 4) <u>Complaints</u>: When a complaint is made about a property violation existing within the community, the ARB staff will visit the site to determine whether or not a violation exists. If the violation is verified by the staff a citation is issued to the property owner. The ARB staff performs these inspections and owners/residents are notified by letter of what issues need to be corrected.

Some of the items routinely inspected include, but are not limited to: condition of exterior wood trim or faded and/or peeling paint, missing, damaged and/or moldy siding, deteriorated fences, damaged garage doors, damaged or missing window screens, overgrown trees and/or shrubs and uncut grass, improper storage of personal items or trash containers, damaged sidewalks or driveways, mailboxes etc.

The most commonly found and cited maintenance issues during the 2016 community-wide inspections are:

To protect and enrich the quality of life for the people, neighborhoods and diverse communities of Fairfax County

#### Dear HOA Representative:

The Fairfax County Health Department's Disease Carrying Insects Program works to minimize the threat of mosquito-borne diseases through active mosquito surveillance, control activities and community education. This summer we are concerned about an emerging disease threat called Zika, a virus that has been spreading throughout Central and South America, Mexico, the Caribbean and parts of the Pacific and is linked to severe birth defects in children born to infected mothers. Florida's Miami-Dade County is the only place in the continental United States to report local transmission of the virus by mosquitoes.

The Asian tiger mosquito (*Aedes albopictus*), a possible vector for this disease, is common in northern Virginia. Because mosquito season will not end until the first hard frost of the year, it is important that residents remain vigilant about preventing mosquitoes around their homes and protecting themselves from bites for the remainder of the summer and fall.

Control mosquitoes in your yard:

- Eliminate standing water. The most effective way to control the Asian tiger mosquito is to tip and toss standing water from artificial containers like tires, buckets, flower pots, corrugated drain pipes, tarps, toys, etc. Discard containers or place indoors.
- Treat standing water with a larvicide if it cannot be eliminated. If you can't get rid of the water, treat it with a mosquito-specific, environmentally-friendly product such as Mosquito Dunks®, which are available at hardware stores and garden centers.
- If mosquitoes are biting, consider treating your yard with an insecticide. Used carefully and according to label instructions, an insecticide can help control biting mosquitoes. Pay attention to bushy green plants, ivy, other ground-covering plants and bamboo, which are hiding places for mosquitoes.
- Organize a neighborhood clean-up. Get rid of litter and debris, discard old tires and manage vegetation that mosquitoes may be using as hiding places.

Protect yourself and your family from mosquito bites:

- Wear an EPA-registered insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus or IR 3535. Insect repellent is safe and effective for children and pregnant women, too. Always apply according to label instructions. If using sunscreen, apply sunscreen first and then repellent.
- Dress to protect. Cover exposed skin by wearing loose-fitting, light-colored long-sleeved shirts and pants. For extra protection, treat clothing with permethrin or purchase permethrin-treated clothing and gear. Never apply permethrin on skin and always follow label instructions.
- Keep mosquitoes out of your home. Keep doors and windows closed. Make sure screens are in good repair. Use air-conditioning when available.
